

NOTES

1. **TB Test Dates** : Must be supplied (eg. one/two year test pattern or three/four year test pattern and date of test or days remaining).
2. **Auction Lot Numbers** : Will be allocated by The Auctioneers.
3. **Official Ear Tag** : This must be the complete number ie. both sides of tag. *Be especially careful with imported cattle.*
4. **Breed** : Initials are acceptable (eg. CH - Charolais, F - Friesian, LIM - Limousin etc).
5. **Sex** : Initials will do (eg. S - Steer, H - Heifer, B - Bull).

LIVESTOCK DECLARATION & CONTRACT OF SALE

I hereby declare that animals included in the Lot Number(s) set out over comply with the following declarations and that the Farm Assurance details I have included on this form at the time of signing are true and correct.

1. Cattle on the holding are not under movement restrictions for other animal disease or public health reasons (excluding a 6-day standstill). All cattle have been examined by the owner and no signs of FMD or other notifiable diseases have been seen.
2. TB Test Status — Tested Cattle Need a TB Test Date Filled In. TB Restricted Cattle can only enter a Red/Slaughter Market and must have a TB24B License accompanying them.
3. Withdrawal periods have been observed for all veterinary medicines and other treatments administered to the animals while on this holding and previous holdings.
4. To the best of my knowledge the animals are not showing signs of any disease or condition that may affect the safety of meat derived from them.
5. No analysis of samples taken from animals on the holding or other samples has shown that the animals in this consignment may have been exposed to any disease or condition that may affect the safety of meat or to substances likely to result in residues in meat.
6. Livestock sold for slaughter is warranted under the Food & Safety Act 1990 and is sold fit for human consumption, the vendor will be responsible for any rejected animals and costs incurred.
7. They have been kept to a standard of husbandry consistent with the DEFRA Code of Recommendations for the Welfare of Livestock.
8. No substances (e.g. growth promoting hormones anti-microbials or B-agonists) are used illegally in rearing or finishing cattle on the farm.
9. All feedstuffs for cattle which are mixed on the farm do not contain :- (a) any approved substances above legally permitted maximum and/or (b) any substances which are used illegally.
10. They have been fed only normal foods and are free from prohibited substances. No animal presented has been fed Protein derived from animal offal.
11. All animals comply with FSA Clean Livestock Policy.
12. All records are retained for traceability purposes.
13. All cattle have come from premises, which has had no movement of FMD susceptible animals onto it in the previous 6 days (other than permitted exceptions).
14. The movement complies with the relevant general licence.
15. All movements comply with the relevant TB Regulations and vendors have checked the TB status of the cattle section before unloading.
16. All cattle must have **two tags** and the twelve digits of the ear tags are correct when presented for sale. The vendor will be responsible for any cost associated with wrong tags, tag discrepancies or loss of tags.
17. No warranty over the effectiveness of any vaccination can be given or implied by either the vendor or the auctioneer.
18. All cattle must be accompanied with a correct BCMS issued passport.

FARM ASSURANCE / VET ATTESTATION (VAN)

19. It is the vendor's responsibility to ensure Farm Assured/ABM Approved Stock must be hauled to the market by ABM Approved Hauliers and accompanied by an ABM Delivery Note.
20. It is the responsibility of the vendor to provide true and complete details regarding Farm Assurance. In the case of any Farm Assurance details provided by the vendor being incomplete or incorrect, the purchaser of the Lot(s) may at their discretion lodge a claim, in which case the vendor may be liable.
21. To comply with Farm Assurance residency all cattle must have been on an assured holding for a minimum of 90 days.
22. **Prime Cattle** -
 - ◆ Vendors of Non-Farm Assured livestock must provide a valid Veterinary Attestation Number (VAN) where required for export eligibility.
 - ◆ Non-Farm Assured livestock without a VAN may still be entered and sold, but their status must be declared at the time of entry.
23. **BVD/Blue Tongue Clause** -The vendor warrants that all information provided in relation to BVD and Bluetongue status is true and accurate. Where an animal is entered and sold as BVD Negative or Tag & Tested and is subsequently proven to be a Persistently Infected (PI) animal, the Purchaser shall be entitled to a full refund of the purchase price.
24. **In-Calf** -The Vendor warrants that all females entered are not in-calf and have not run with a bull.
25. **Data Protection** - The Vendor consents to the Auctioneers disclosing BVD and Bluetongue documentation and associated animal health information to the Purchaser where relevant to the sale.

N.B. IT IS THE VENDORS LEGAL RESPONSIBILITY TO ENSURE THAT ALL INFORMATION IS CORRECT AND THE AUCTIONEERS HAVE NO LEGAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE CORRECTNESS OF THE INFORMATION, AS SUPPLIED OR EARTAG DISCREPANCIES.
