Christmas cheer in abundance and a trade which was electric making the show and sale an extremely memorable day. A huge vote of thanks to our judges, vendors, buyers, sponsors and staff whose contribution to the day make it special. I am extremely humbled by the level of support received on the day from the number of quality cattle forward, the army of buyers in attendance and the generosity of our sponsors!!

Trade was dynamic with no fewer than twenty-eight cattle selling in excess of 300p and not all these were in the show either. Show cattle averaged 350p with an overall market average of 256p.

Our Judges performed a fantastic job with Mr Richard Taylor judging our clean and Mr Tom Baldwin judging our bulls.

Mr Ian Brown and Family, Werrington taking top honours on the day with a tremendous British Blue heifer weighing 470 kilos winning Class Six Young Farmers Class then winning Market Drayton Clean Champion and finally being topped for our Supreme Champion. The heifer then sold for 650p realising £3,055.00 and finally being purchased by Mr Ed Nield of Betchton.

Reserve Champion was a Limousin heifer again shown by The Brown Family, Werrington. The heifer won Class Five Smallholders Class, she weighed 548 kilos and sold for 420p and returned £2,301.60 and purchased by our judge Mr Richard Taylor.

Farm Assured Champion was awarded to a British Blue steer shown by Mr Brian Taylor and Family. The 534 kilo steer sold to 590p to gross £3,150.60 and purchased by Mr Ed Nield.

75 Bulls - Few less bulls forward but what we lacked in quantity we made up for in quality! Champion Bull was awarded to the winner of Class 14 Best Continental Bull the British Blue weighed 370 kilos selling to 370p (£2,649.20) from Mr Paul Moseley and Family, Allostock. Mr Edwards Evans and Family, Halfway House Limousins sold to 308p (£1,915.76) and 306p (£1,634.04), E.T. White & Son, Brewood Limousin to 298p (£1,817.80) and topped the natives with an Angus to 278p (£1,818.12), The Darlington Springbank saw their Limousins to 296p (£2,350.24), 280p (£2,217.60) and 266p (£2,298.24), Mr Bernard Parsons and Family, Golden Hill Lane had a tremendous run of bulls to 294p (£2,010.96), 293p (£1,980.68), 284p (£1,936.88), 283p (£1,533.86) and 280p (£2,217.60).
