Numbers looking good especially for two greens back-to-back and a big thank you to our vendors for their ongoing support and its also fantastic to see new and returning faces back to Market Drayton Market. Busy ring side of buyers with further feeders certainly out in force and requiring more cows to feed over the coming weeks and combined with exporters and end users a very brisk trade resulted. Trade was buoyant from the first bull to the last cow and feeding cows trading 180p to 220p certainly adding value being pounds more than sending them to slaughter. More required and should you be unsure please give me a bell.

Talking points on the night returned at 250p or £1,960.00 for sucklers, 220p or £1,797.72 for clean, 195p or £1,550.64 for dairy and 186p or £1,629.92 for bulls. The overall market average returned at 172p.

## Slurry Infrastructure Grant Now Open!

The online eligibility checker is now open with the deadline being 31st January 2023. If successful farmers will be invited to submit a full application by 28th June 2024. Applicants must fit any grant funded stores with an impermeable cover unless installing a slurry bag or using acidification treatment.

Farmers must use the grant to reach at least 6 months storage. This can be done by:

- 1 - Replacing existing stores
- 2 - Add additional storage
- 3 - Expand an existing store

The minimum grant is £25,000 with the maximum being £250,000 for each applicant business.

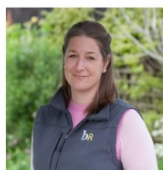
