Red certainly did not mean stop with demand totally outstripping supply and many more cows could have been sold to vendors advantage. An extremely mixed entry regarding quality with no export type cows in the mix and a large proportion of worked, parlour cows in the mix. Stand out prices returned at 270p or £2,289.60 for bulls, 251p or £1,723.12 for clean, dairies to 200p or £1,510.08 and sucklers to 187p or £1,466.08. The overall market average returned at 165p.

72 Dairy - A very mixed entry but easily absorbed by our buyers and as always we do not cherry pick the best and leave the rest!! Young meated cows took pole position at 200p (£1,140.00) from Mrs V.E. Lloyd, Buerton. GM.&JA. Williams, Hanmer cows to 190p (£1,197.00), 180p (£1,004.40), The Holdcroft Family, Sandbach saw their cows to 183p (£1,493.28), 176p (£1,510.08), 170p (£1,336.20). JR.&AMB. James, St Martins cow to 179p (£1,278.06) etc, JM.& JK. Cliffe & Son, Austerson cow to 176p (£1,327.04), C. & B. Slater, Whitmore cow to 175p (£1,221.50), T.A. Dodson & Son, Bickley cow to 173p (£1,363.24) and Mr R.D. Probin, Chorley cow to 170p (£1,169.60) to mention a few. The section average returned at 149p (£960.62).

19 Sucklers - Soupcon forward which is understandable as the option to value add on a red is limited due to it being a slaughter market. Vast majority of the entry were restricted and older types and these sold to 187p (£1,466.08) for a Simmental from The Slater Family, Whitmore and further Simmental from KA.&AS. Littler, Common Duddon selling to 181p (£1,194.60). Natives saw Herefords to 163p (£1,219.24) from MJ. & HM. Timmis, Baschurch. The section average returned at 156p (£937.52).

3 Bulls - Dominated with stock bulls and these sold to 270p (£2,289.60) for a cracking Limousin from Hunt Partnership, Hough. Angus to 183p (£1,987.38) from Mr Roy Jefferies, Knutsford and black and whites to 162p (£835.92) from GS. Ball & Sons, Rodeheath. The section average returned at 208p (£1,704.30).

20 Clean - Restricted heifers took pole position at 251p (£1,581.30) from Mr J.E. Charlesworth, Marchington Woodlands and further Limousin heifer to 245p (£1,376.90). The Charlesworth's also topped the steers with black and white to 238p (£1,723.12), 237p (£1,578.42), 230p (£1,633.00) etc.

being second quality light types and very lean older types which would be a little harder to place but this said a tremendous trade for the stamp of cattle forward.

NEW VETERINARY ATTESTATION RULE for Farmers to be introduced on 13 December

ACTION NEEDED NOW All livestock vendors to take action now and do not leave it until December to ask their vet for a farm visit and a signed declaration.

What's Changing?

Changes in legislation as from 13 December 2023 will require all producers selling livestock for slaughter to have had an annual farm veterinary visit to allow their animals and or part of any animal to be exported out of the UK. The purpose of this new rule is to comply with EU Export Regulations to verify the absence of notifiable disease and provide general advice on farm bio-security.

What Do Producers Need To Do?

Producers will be required to obtain a signed declaration from their vet that the visit has taken place. Obtaining a signed veterinary attestation must be done at least once over a 12 month period and can be combined with any routine veterinary visit. Farmers and Vets much keep a copy.

Calf Housing for Health and Welfare 2023

STAGE ONE OF APPLICATION NOW OPEN

Farmers are now able to apply for the Online Checker as stage one of the application process, the Rural Payments Agency have informed us.

The Calf Housing for Health and Welfare Grant enables the building of new or upgrading/replacing existing calf housing, to improve the health and welfare of cattle up to the age of 6 months. The housing should provide a good ambient environment and facilitate social contact amongst calves.

To apply farmers must be:

- Located in England
- Have 10 or more head of cattle
- Be the land owner or have a tenancy agreement lasting at least 5 years after the project has been completed.

Farmers with new/start-up businesses or farmers with less than 10 head of cattle are ineligible for the grant at this time.
