A lot of small plain cows, foreign cows and non farm assured cows in the mix still sold on a reasonable trade with meat and heavier cows a sharp trade. Plenty of demand for clean saw an overall average of 147p. Top slot hit 160p for dairies, 180p for sucklers, 249p for clean and 170p for bulls.

85 Dairy - Meat sold well with a lot of plainer bellied cows forward saw the best race away to 160p for a Friesian cow weighing 684kgs to accumulate £1,094.40 for M.&J.C. Gould Ltd, Bomere Heath. NEW VETERINARY ATTESTATION RULE for Farmers to be introduced on 13 December

ACTION NEEDED NOW All live-stock vendors to take action now and do not leave it until December to ask their vet for a farm visit and a signed declaration.

What's Changing?

Changes in legislation as from 13 December 2023 will require all producers selling livestock for slaughter to have had an annual farm veterinary visit to allow their animals and or part of any animal to be exported out of the UK. The purpose of this new rule is to comply with EU Export Regulations to verify the absence of notifiable disease and provide general advice on farm bio-security.

What Do Producers Need To Do?

Producers will be required to obtain a signed declaration from their vet that the visit has taken place. Obtaining a signed veterinary attestation must be done at least once over a 12 month period and can be combined with any routine veterinary visit. Farmers and Vets much keep a copy.

Sustainable Farming Incentive (SFI) 2023

Applications for the 2023 Sustainable Farming Incentive (SFI) are now open. Farmers will be paid to undertake actions that improve farm productivity, whilst protecting the environment.

The agreement will last for three years from its start date and can be 'upgraded' annually to add more actions or eligible land. There is no current deadline to apply for the SFI and applicants are encouraged to apply to suit them.

On top of the SFI actions, the scheme offers a 'management payment' of £20 per ha for the first 50 ha entered into the agreement. Additionally, the government are offering an 'acceleration payment' to applicants with agreements that are live before the end of the year. This means they will receive 25% of their annual payment within the first month, to help with cashflow and input costs when setting up the agreement.

Your total annual payment will be paid in four equal quarterly instalments. Although the SFI does not offer funding for capital items, it can be used alongside the Countryside Stewardship Capital Grant and the Farming Investment Fund.

SFI actions include:

Soil & hedgerow management options

e.g. SAM3 (Herbal leys) - £382 per hectare.

e.g. IGL2 (Winter bird food on improved grassland) - £474 per hectare.
