Leading lights shone extremely brightly to 240p or £2,035.20 for clean, 234p or £2,611.44 for sucklers, 228p or £1,657.88 for dairy and 214p or £2,324.04 for bulls. The overall market average returned at 164p.

A good entry of weanlings forward when you consider how many have already been sold this spring and how far it feels away from turnout! Overall an excellent show of cattle and trade would be very good again but the edge would be off some cattle, mostly heifers compared to the last sale. Why you may ask? The weather certainly isn't helping and the wait until turn out continues so there was certainly some hesitancy today that we haven't seen for a while.

Starting with the bulls, a dominant show of 6 to 10 month old bulls which if well grown saw plenty of demand. Top spot going to a 9 month Blues at £880 from D.&D. Parsons, Market Drayton. Followed by 8 month Limousins from RK Thomas Farming, Little Onn. In the younger section we saw 3mo Limousin bulls from JS.&HJ. Gleave, Wilkesley at £520.

**Veterinary Attestations – Effective 13<sup>th</sup> December 2023**  
**Guidance for LAA Member Livestock Markets**

**1. What's changing?**

Changes in EU legislation, as from 13<sup>th</sup> December 2023, will require all producers selling livestock for slaughter to have had an annual on-farm veterinary visit to allow their animals, and/or part of any animal, to be exported out of the UK.

Up until now, a farmer declaration has satisfied the requirements, however from 13<sup>th</sup> December 2023, producers will require a Veterinary Attestation. This will certify that an annual on-farm visit has taken place to verify the absence of notifiable diseases and provide general advice on farm biosecurity, meeting EU requirements.

The Vet will provide the producer with a unique Veterinary Attestation Number, known as a "VAN" (see section 2) within their certificate. Templates can be found [here](#).

**2. What is the "VAN" number?**

The Veterinary Attestation Number, known as "VAN", is a unique reference number provided by Vets to producers within their Veterinary Attestation certificate to certify that an annual on-farm visit has taken place. A VAN number is valid for 12 months. This information will need to be provided to livestock markets, and onwards to buyers, for livestock sold for slaughter (see section 3).

The VAN number is made up of 20 digits as follows, including the Vets RCVS number, the CPH number the VAN corresponds to, and expiry date.

For example:  
**1234567-12/345/6789-0624**  
[MRCVS number]-[CPH number]-[Valid to the end of June 2024].
