A fantastic entry of Weanlings with both numbers and quality on offer today. Once again there was no stopping the trade, you just cant ask enough for some of these weanlings!! From top to bottom we saw new levels of demand but the younger weanlings look the dearest by far. Todays average was £698 per head.

Only 52 bulls on offer with many bull buyers

A lovely run of 4 month British Blues from Red Hall Farm, Betley topped at £810.

The steers averaged £729 per head. The heifers of course look just as dear as everything else, with top price going to £1380 for an 11 month Hereford from Mickley Stud Ltd.
