The biggest weekly entry of the year had something for everyone.

The champion was the first prize pedigree cow from Clayden Farm Partners, Crewe, the second calver CLAYDEN ORACLE AMANDA sold for the top price of £3,800. Their 6 second calvers averaged £2,883 with others selling to £3,200 and £2,900.

The second prize pedigree cow was BIDEA VAULT PAPOOSE 2 from Ray Brown & Partners, Holmes Chapel which sold for £3,300. They sold 8 milkers to average £3,004 including heifers at £3,400, £3,350, £2,980, £2,950 and £2,850.
