3,400GNS TOP AT WILDMAN SALE

Buyers from Wales and the West Country again joined a very large Midlands turnout at the dispersal sale of the pedigree Drakelow herd of Holstein Friesians for Colin Wildman which was held on his farm near Middlewich, Cheshire where 25 cattle sold for over 3,000gns to a top of 3,400gns.

The top price cow was a second calver sired by Topcroft Pesky Trix which had recorded 10,247kgs as a heifer was due to calve in late October to an Aberdeen Angus service and stayed in the county of Cheshire.

The same Cheshire buyer gave 3,200gns for a Moet Melody sired second calver again calving in late October to the Angus.

Autumn calvers attracted spirited bidding with a Staffordshire buyer taking home a heifer for 3,200gns, the Koepon Raptor daughter was carrying a Denovo Charter for early October.

The same Staffordshire buyer paid 3,200gns for another Koepon Raptor daughter which was carrying her third calf by the Angus for late October.

A Cornish buyer took home 52 milkers including the 3,200gns Denovo Clove sired third calver due in November to the Angus which had given 10,810 kgs with her second calf and giving 45kgs when sold.

In calf heifers carrying Angus calves met an improving trade with the best selling to 2,600gns, this was for the late June calving Denovo Kenmore daughter out of a 13,788kgs dam by Applejax purchased by a Cheshire buyer. A similarly bred in-calf heifer sold for 2,500gns to the same buyer.

Heifer calves sold exceptionally well topping at 900gns for a 4 month old calf by Monk off a 9,622kgs 4.87%F dam with other 4 and 5 month old calves at 850gns and 800gns six times.

Pleasing number for the time of year and a red market and its great to see more and more restricted cattle utilising the "Red Market". Huge vote of thanks for our vendors and buyers support and on the night few

less buyers but all orders covered resulting in a very firm and competitive trade throughout. Nationally trade has eased mainly on clean beef and young bulls but there seems very little correction on cull cattle.

Headline prices reverberated around the ring to 385p or £3,672.90 for bulls, 380p or £2,416.80 for overage clean, 330p or £2,666.40 for dairy and 320p or £2,242.20 for sucklers. The overall market average returned at 285p or £1,719.62.

84 Dairies - Trade remaining extremely buoyant for all weights, grades, breeds and nationalities. Trade peaked at 330p or £2,666.40 for young black and white from J. & J. Numbers holding well and considering the talk ring-side about the "deadweight gloom and doom" trade was remarkably brisk. Yes, some cattle a little easier and the bulls, but good shaped clean heifers and steers still commanding a premium and in some cases dearer on the week. Again a big thank you to all our vendors and buyers for their continued support.

FARMING EQUIPMENT AND TECHNOLOGY FUND (FETF) 2025

Farmers in England can apply for grants between £1,000 and £25,000 per theme to invest in new equipment under the FETF 2025

The application window opens on 29th May and will close at midday on 10th July 2025

Grant Themes:

- Productivity: Enhance farm efficiency & profitability.
- Slurry Management: Improve slurry collection, storage, testing, & spreading.
- Animal Health and Welfare: Promote livestock health & welfare; applications can receive a 20% score increase with evidence of a veterinary consultation.

Each applicant can submit one application per theme. The fund is competitive, and items must be new and meet minimum requirements.



SFI 2024 - NEW STATEMENT FROM THE MINISTER FOR FOOD SECURITY & RURAL AFFAIRS RELEASED

A statement from the Minister for Food Security and Rural Affairs says that applicants who began their applications between 12th January and 11th March this year will be granted a six-week window to complete their submissions.

Agreements will be capped at £9,300 per year and the RPA will contact eligible applicants shortly to let them know when this six-week window will open and close. The reformed SFI scheme is still anticipated to launch this summer, watch this space!
