Reasonable seasonal entry selling on a brisker trade, especially for plainer cows finding another gear forward on the week. Despite the talk of deadweight price drop the trade seems to have moved forward and in some cases "jumped" forward!! Huge vote of thanks to our vendors both near and far and to our buyers who were back to capacity on the day.

Top of the shop this week saw overage clean to 328p or £2,532.16, sucklers to 316p or £3,232.32, dairy to 313p or £2,102.10 and bulls to 300p or £3,462.00. The overall market average returned at 242p or £1,477.22.
