Another strong entry of calves forward this week, with trade remaining brisk and closely in line with last week's levels. A notably stronger show of calves was presented, attracting keen interest and competitive bidding throughout. Although there were slightly fewer buyers around the ring, demand remained more than sufficient for the number of calves on offer. The overall average stood at £397 per head. Demand continues to be exceptionally strong for the top 50% of calves, while the bottom end of the trade mirrored last weeks prices, with buyers remaining selective. To avoid any softening in price as we move

towards peak summer calving, it remains essential to ensure your calves are in that top-performing bracket.

Friesian Bulls – A very mixed show, a lot of demand for best types but very little for plain bulls. Top price was £245 from N. Dakin & Sons, Walgherton. Best: £140-£220, Mediums: £80-£130, Smalls: £30-£70.

Native Bulls – There was no let-up in trade across all grades, with particularly strong demand for best and medium types as we've had 47 head exceed £500! Top price: £640 for an Angus from Red Barn Farm, Fradswell. Best: £500-£600, Mediums: £360-£475, Smalls: £200-£340.

Continental Bulls – A strong trade across all grades with demand continuing to outstrip supply. Top price: £1,000 for a cracking Charolais bull from G.A. Hargreaves & Son, Cresswell. Best: £600-£750, Mediums: £475-£575, Smalls: £300-£450.

Native Heifers – A super trade with demand high for good quality with 34 over £375, a gap to plainer heifers which follows on from last week. Top price: £550 for an Angus from RJ.&DJ. Clement, Gorsey Bank. Best: £375-£475, Mediums: £250-£360, Smalls: £140-£240.


