£3,600 TOP AT COOPER HERD SALE

Local buyers were joined by many from further away at the dispersal sale of the flying herd of Holstein Friesians for Graham Cooper and his daughters held on their farm near Alsager, Staffordshire.

26 cattle sold for over £3,000 with a top price of £3,600 for a second calver which had been calved a month giving 39kgs daily after recording 9,724kgs as a heifer and was purchased by a Stafford buyer.

The next highest price of £3,580 was for the last milker in the sale, a third calver which was still giving 46kgs daily after calving at the end of June and was bought by a buyer from Cornwall. The same Cornishman purchased 34 cattle.

A father and son from West Wales purchased 38 cattle between them for their respective farms near Cardigan. Their purchases included a second calver at £3,520 which had calved in February and due in March to the British Blue, she was still giving 43kgs daily when sold

In-calf heifers due in January to the Hereford sold for £2,080 and bulling heifers to £1,120.

The January 2023 born unregistered Aberdeen Angus bull made £2,780.
