ORGANIC MILKERS TOP AT £2,700 TWICE

The well attended sale of Organic Danish Red and Brown Swiss cross dairy cattle for Paul Hickson held on farm near Ellesmere, Shropshire topped at £2,700 twice.

Both top prices were for freshly calved Danish Red cross heifers, one being purchased by a Shrewsbury buyer and the other by a Macclesfield, Cheshire

buyer.

The same Shrewsbury buyer paid the top cow price of £2,650 for a fresh calved Brown Swiss cross second calver.

North Wales buyers from Wrexham paid £2,500 twice for second and third calvers and a Bala buyer paid £2,400 for a Fleckvieh cross fresh heifer.

Many cattle went to buyers from Somerset and Warwickshire.

A very successful sale for a once a day milked herd. All 175 cattle averaged £1,840.

Another good entry forward and a very seasonal show of worked and parlour cows however this said all selling on an absolute flying trade with demand certainly outstripping supply! The further feeding trade is electric with younger leaner cows 30 to 50 months and in some cases older very keenly contested and worth pounds more on their legs than going direct. Returning to the rostrum a real joy to sell especially for the time of year and a huge vote of thanks to all our vendors and buyers for their support !!

Talking points on the night returned at 345p or £3,415.50 for bulls, 340p or £2,389.92 for sucklers and 299p or £2,231.08 for dairy. The overall market average returned at 240p or £1,407.18.

One for the books! The October Show & Sale supported by the Western Holstein Club, sponsored by Gro-Agri and judged by Richard and Rachel Moss was record breaking.

Gwilym's return to the rostrum following recent heart surgery coincided with the best ever trade at Drayton for an exceptionally high quality entry which made Richard and Rachel's judging duties very difficult as there were so many good ones forward, a real credit to both Club Members and commercial producers.
