Nice to see more numbers forward and selling to a very pleasing trade throughout. Meated cows commanded a premium as ever with heavier plainer sorts or cows requiring further finishing also looking very well sold. Leading lights shone to 290p or £2,344.26 for dairies, sucklers to 328p or £3,177.90, 369p or £4,538.70 for bulls and 290p or £2,610 for overage clean. The overall market average was returned at 248p or £1,585.26.

110 Dairies - A very mixed show in terms of quality all look very well sold. The best hit 290p for a Friesian weighing 692kgs to gross £2,006.80 for Williamson Farming Ltd, Austerson. A good show following some large entries in recent sales. Trade remains unchanged, with plenty of demand, particularly for grazing types. The usual trend continued, with smaller cattle generally selling at a premium. Plenty of smart groups of cattle were forward and proved a pleasure to sell. There were also more single lots than usual, likely end-of-batch cattle, and these sold very well on the day. Today's sale average was £936 per head.

A shorter entry of bulls, particularly older sorts. 10 month Herefords sold to £1,480 from K.&JM. Jackson, Whitchurch, with 9 month Charolais reaching £1,440 from A. Coutts & Son, Knutsford. Younger bulls saw 7 month Charolais to £1,060 from B.J. Mould Ltd, Stafford; 7 month Blues to £1,000 from L.M. Morris, Melinbarhedyn; 5 month Charolais to £950 from Mr J. Brown, Stafford and £930 from S.&S. Brain, Cresswell; and 5 month Blues to £910 from J.W. Gibson & Son, Childs Ercall. 8 month Friesian bulls from Mr J.L.

Donlon, Scholar Green made £735. All 31 bulls averaged £928.56.

The steer trade was fantastic, with buyers keen on both feeding and grazing types. Top call was 8 month Blues at £1,700 from OM.&JR. Whittingham, Mucklestone; 8 month Limousins at £1,420 from S.&S. Brain, Cresswell; 8 month Blues at £1,370 from Mr M. Latham, Derby; and a 10 month Beef Shorthorn at £1,320 from Mr J.B. Beech, Sandbach. 6 month Blues sold to £1,300 from Mr M. Groom, Croxton, while 8 month Friesian steers reached £980 from Mr M. Latham, Derby. Among the younger cattle, 5 month Limousins made £1,160 from R.I. Owen & Co, Llanbrynmair, who also sold 5 month Blues at £1,010. 4 month Angus sold to £1,020 from DE.&SE. Furnival Ltd, Market Drayton. All 148 steers averaged £954.81.

A good mix of heifers forward, with all grades selling exceptionally well. Top price went to a 10 month show-potential Blue at £1,980 from OM.&JR. Whittingham, Mucklestone, who also sold another at £1,740. 13 month Simmentals from Cherry Orchard Farms, Longdon realised £1,580, with 10 month Simmentals close behind at £1,560 from Mr A.W. Cadman, Market Drayton. 9 month Limousins sold to £1,390 from S.&S. Brain, Cresswell, and 10 month Angus reached £1,180 from R. Langford & Partners, Tattenhall. At the younger end, 6 month Blues made £1,160 from Mr M. Groom, Croxton, and 6 month Herefords £1,080 from S.&S. Brain. 5 month Blues from SW.&SM. Evans, Smallwood hit £1,000, matched by 5 month Limousins from R.I. Owen & Co, Llanbrynmair. All 198 heifers averaged £883.91.

Well what can I say?? Only the beef trade seems to be melting faster than a snow cone in The Sahara. Live sales have remained fairly strong in comparison to deadweight quotes but it finally looks like that party has come home to roost!! An expected lack lustre trade when you see how the trade has been dropping since last Wednesday with demand for beef capitulating week-on-week. Last year's prices went up weekly, this year prices have dropped weekly!! Sorry to be the bearer of bad news and I only hope it's a bump in the road otherwise there is going to be some extremely long faces specially when you see the value of store cattle. The one positive on the day handy weight butchers heifers seem to be holding relatively well in comparison to heavy breaking cattle. On the day being a green vendors have the option to withdraw their cattle if not happy with the trade but only one vendor choose to not sell one heifer as is your right!

Top of the shop this week returned at 420p or £2,629.20 for heifers, 418p or £4,048.98 for bulls and 382p or £2,682.52 for steers. The overall market average was returned at 340p or £2,044.72.

67 Bulls - A very mixed entry selling on a competitive trade considering the doldrums we are experiencing at the moment, 400 pence is a hard target to hit with 300p the closer goal. Trade did peak at 418p or £3,569.72 for a Limousin from distant supports The Lewis Family, Buttington and their further Limousin grossed £4,048.98. Will & Jackie Forrester, Colehurst saw their

Limousins to 395p (£3,175.80) and 380p (£2,842.40), The Gosmore Family, Tattenhall saw their Limousins to 387p (£2,685.78) and 386p (£2,424.08), Mr Pete Moseley & Family, Allstock Limousin to 381p (£2,781.30) etc. Natives sold to 348p (£1,691.28) for a Hereford from Mr Howard James & Family, Holts Barn. Drayton specials saw black and whites to 320p (£1,900.80) from W.E. Bennett & Sons, Ashbourne. The section average returned at 338p or £2,150.57.

42 Steers - A large proportion of heavier, commercial types forward and these would have seen the biggest correction in price at present. Trade reached 382p or £2,498.28 for shapely Limousin from The Richardson Family, Pinfold Lane. Mr Jonny Warner & Family, Stoke Heath saw their Charolais to 380p (£2,204.00) and Mr Andrew Williamson, Utkinton Limousin to 370p (£2,249.60). In the lump A.E. Barlow & Co, Hamstall Ridware saw his trio of Continentals to £2,682.52, £2,633.40 and £2,624.80. Natives sold to 340p (£2,148.80) for Angus from Mr Fred Watson & Family, Sandon. The section average returned at 340p or £2,222.38.

69 Heifers - Very similar story to the steers with the only caveat being handy weight butchers heifers easier to place, but few and far between. Honours shared for top slot at 420p twice with Mr Jonny Warner & Family, Stoke Heath Limousin to gross £2,074.80 and Mr Edward Evans & Family, Lane Farm Limousin realising £2,629.20 and their further cattle to 408p (£2,415.36) and 390p (£2,550.60), The Binns Family, Stone Heath saw their Limousins to 404p (£2,383.60), 390p (£2,418.00) and 371p (£2,374.40) and Mr Ken McBride, Astley Moss Limousin to 384p (£2,304.00). Natives saw Angus to 348p (£1,774.80) from Mr Fred Watson & Family, Sandon. The section average returned at 340p or £1,981.92.

Some nice cows and calves forward attracting brisk bidding trading at £2,400 to £2,700 topping at £2,750 for a pure Hereford outfit. Young bulls topped at £1,060 for a Hereford and averaged £1,030.
