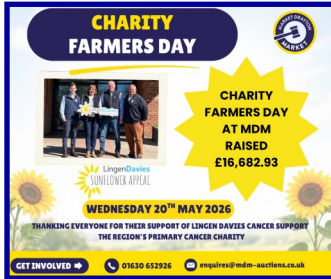

More cows forward for the green market selling to a very competitive trade throughout. Meat commanding a premium and leaner cows perhaps a shade easier with grazing sorts looking very well sold. Top slots hit 273p or £2,233.90 for dairies, 289p or £2,525.60 for sucklers, 288p or £2,880.80 for bulls. An overall market average was returned at 236p or £1,506.37.

PEACOTE DISPERSAL

The dispersal on behalf of Messrs J.R. Cheney, Peating Magna sold to a very respectable £2,572.50 this was the last lot of the day. Peacote Lizzard Midge, she sold due to calve in July giving 266kgs daily.

It was very noticeable that the trade went up two gears as soon as we started on the dry and Autumn calvers with nearly all the £2,000 plus cows falling in this bracket.

Second highest price was £2,415 for Peacote Oddi Paula due in July giving 27kgs daily.

Cows calves in January to April running back with the Friesian bulls sold to £2,226 for Peacote Oddi Daisy giving 23.5kgs daily and £2,121 for Peacote Oddi Nicola giving 40kgs daily.

It was also very noticeable that buyers were looking for strong Powerful British Friesian and Friesian

types but less interested the more Holstein type cows.

A decent number forward and another very pleasing trade. Over 80% of the entry were 6-9 months of age, so this suited our grazing buyers which were definitely the biggest demand today. There has been more bounce in the trade than we expected, based on the current prices further up the chain. Today's sale average was £876 per head.

A decent entry of bulls, with some really good quality on offer. Top spot went to 8 month Blues from W.&P. A good number forward considering the lure of trade is not conducive to market cattle at present but this said a pleasing return to the rostrum after annual leave. Trade on the day a little bit more buoyant especially for cattle with shape and loin in contrast to very light or extremely heavy types which would be a little harder to place. To summarise in the current climate a pleasing days trading with the majority of vendors happy with prices on the day and breeching the 400p market thirteen times!!!

Leading lights shone brightly to 468p or £2,577.96 for heifers, 448p or £2,988.16 for steers and 419p or £3,060.00 for bulls. The overall market average returned at 335p or £2,044.00.

62 Bulls - A very mixed entry forward selling on a firmer trade on the week. Sucklers raced way to 419p or

£2,874.34 for a Limousin from Mr Mick Gould & Family, Bomere Heath and a further bull to 406p or £3,045.00. Distant supporters The Jones Family, Chirbury saw their Limousin to 408p to return £3,060.00 and 388p (£2,366.80), Mr Graham Johnson, Dunston Heath Limousin to 297p (£2,389.94) and 386p (£2,331.44) and R.
