Another reasonable show for a summer and harvest entry and selling on a buoyant trade throughout. The green market certainly adds a different dynamic with young, lean and suckler types all benefiting from additional bidding and in some places adding value! The entry however did have a large contingent of worked and parlour cows and with the lack of grass it is understandable why they had been marketed. Cows still a real pleasure to sell and dare I say it many more could have been sold to vendors advantage.

Top rewards returned at 335p or £2,679.04 for over age clean, 276p or £2,020.32 for sucklers, 270p or £2,075.70 for bulls and 268p or £2,224.40 for dairies. The overall market average returned at 235p or £1,490.37.

58 Dairies - A very mixed entry dominated with leaner parlour types with meaty cows in short supply. Meaty cows did race away to 268p or £2,224.40 for a Montbeliarde from Martin Partners, Longford who also saw 251p (£1,892.54) for their Norwegian Red etc. R.E. Studley & Co, Farndon Fleckvieh to 263p (£1,704.24) and Mr James Oulton & Family, Audley black and whites to 255p (£1,647.30), 245p (£1,587.60) etc. Mr E.J. Studley, Aldersey did see their black and white returned £2,089.62 to mention a few. The section average returned at 211p or £1,288.98.

22 Sucklers - Humble number forward and mainly dominated with natives and these sold to 276p or £2,020.32 for Angus from R.W. Harper & Partners, Burland to 267p (£1,890.36). Mr Peter Crossmore & Family, Nantwich Limousin to 274p (£1,709.76) and Mr Lance Atkin & Family, Whitgreave Limousin to 266p (£1,941.80) to mention a few. The section average returned at 249p or £1,552.23.

7 Bulls - Mainly younger lighter cross bred dairy bulls and these sold to 270p (£1,738.80) from Mana Kau Farming Ltd, Whitmore and also 258p (£1,506.72), 250p (£1,370.00) etc. Angus stock bull to 255p (£2,075.70) from The Francis Family, Newtown. The section average returned at 247p or £1,546.03.

9 Overage Clean - Mr Chris Matthews & Family, Blythe Bridge dominated the steers with their Hereford Crosses selling to 318p or £2,442.24, 311p (£2,674.60), 299p (£2,679.04), 293p (£2,525.66) and 290p (£2,354.80). Mr Phil Tushingham & Family, Clotton topped the heifers with their Blues to 335p (£2,324.90) and 330p (£2,356.20). The Matthews Family, Blythe Bridge also saw 321p (£2,356.14) for their Limousin and 312p (£2,233.92 for a Hereford).

A good little entry for harvest time and no real change in demand or trade. Some buyers left empty-handed, highlighting that there is still sufficient demand to keep the trade on a firm footing even with the grass situation. Lets hope some significant rain falls shortly to boost the outlook for the weanlings over the coming months. Todays overall average was £831 per head.

A small numbers of bulls with mostly youngsters forward including 26 Friesians. Top spot went to a 6 month Beef Shorthorn at £1,080 from Mickley Stud Ltd, Market Drayton; who sold others at £1,060 and £970. 9 month Angus from MEP Engineering, Apedale also made £1,080. A lovely group of 4 month Angus from Mr M.T. Jones, Leek looked the trade of the day at £910. 3 month Limousins at £805 from Mr E.J. Nash, Fulford. 7 month Friesian bulls topped at £700 from Mr L.S. Hopwood, Urmston. All 50 bulls averaged £644.

The steer trade was fast paced with all ages in high demand, the younger they were the dearer they looked today. Top spot went to some super sucklers from Mr Jonathan Worthington, Nether Alderley, who sold 10 month Limousins for £1,590 and 9 month Simmentals for £1,500. Topping the Blues were 10 month at £1,280 from J.W. Cotton & Son, Gratwich, who also sold 10 month Herefords for £1,120. A group of 8 month Blues from Cherry Orchard Farms, Longdon realised £1,100 and 8 month Angus made £1,070 from Mr M. Clarke, Crewe. In the younger steers 4 month Charolais made £1,030 for Mr M.D. Berrisford, Betley; 4 month Blues made £1,010 from Mr C. Baty, Nantwich and a 4 month Blue from Meadow Brook Farming, Wattenhall sold for £970. All 108 steers averaged £863.

A few less heifers which led to plenty of demand with a super trade for all types, mostly older heifers forward too. Top spot was £1,460 for a 10 month Simmental from Mr J. Worthington; 11 month Blues from Cherry Orchard Farms sold for £1,400. A packed of 12 month Angus hit £1,240 for Mr G. Rawlinson, Astley Moss; Charolais sold to £1,180 from A.&W. Piggott, Shocklach and 9 month Blues from Hollies Farm Dairy

Services, Malpas made £1,170. In the younger heifers we saw 5 month Angus from A.&CS. Lloyd, Caersws sell for £850; 3 month Blues from Mr M. Narloch, Ash made £810; 5 month Herefords at £800 from GA.&FA. Brassington, Longton. All 87 heifers averaged £903.

Few less forward more as a consequence of a harvest day with all sections a little quieter. Trade still remains very balanced and a two tier trade on the day, with handy weight, lean and younger cattle very easy to place but heavier types still harder work and plenty about with these still adding up in the lump! Big thank you as always for our vendors support and great to see the strength and depth ringside from our buyers.

Summer sizzlers returned at 446p or £2,682.26 for heifers, 404p or £2,750.40 for steers and 391p and £2,973.52 for bulls. The overall market average returned at 340p or £2,055.07.

53 Bulls - Commercial bulls looked best sold this week these 0+ with a loin 335p to 355p depending on weight. Weight at times a bit of a stumbling block especially for heavy lean types but all changing hands. Sucklers sold to 391p or £2,909.04 from Mr D. Ingham, High Offley and further Limousin to 381p (£2,926.08), FS.&MJ. Heath, Pipe Gate saw 286p (£2,261.96) for their Limousin and distant supporter JM.&BJ. Langford, Tregyon saw their Limousin to 385p (£2,556.40). Native types saw Herefords to 344p (£2,201.60) from Graham Johnson, Dunston Heath. Drayton specials found another gear forward with black and whites to 341p or £2,189.22 from W.E. Bennett & Sons, Somersal Ashbourne and credit where its due tremendous black and white and well fed. The section average returned at 332p or £2,184.25.
