The sale of the entire youngstock portion were sold to a very consistent trade in all sections.

Incalf heifers calving October through to January were highly sort after selling to £2,420 for a Blumenfeld Sedona daughter, closely followed by three heifers at £2,400. The second incalf heifers ranged from £2,000 to £2,420.

There was a notable reluctance to pay over the odds for February, March and April calving heifers with these ranging from £1,400 to £1,650 whilst bulling heifers made the money at £1,300 to £1,520 very similar.

Reasonable entry forward considering the industry finding itself in at present, chasing milk, hence every drop out of the cows while still trying to manage the lack of grass situation. Its this lack of grass situation especially in Europe that is resulting in a lot of cattle being slaughtered a lot earlier and flooding the boning halls throughout Europe and the UK. Lets hope this early Autumn washes through quickly and prices harden going forward.?! Trade extremely competitive on the night with further finishers adding value to younger, leaner cattle and a couple of processing orders operating stronger with the schools going back. Cattle easier sold but not at the high level of trade we have been experiencing pre-summer holidays.

Top of the shop we saw sucklers to 257p or £2,086.24, dairy to 256p or £1,970.64 and bulls to 180p or £1,044.00.

83 Dairies - Understandably a lot of lean parlour types forward with very few meated cows in the ranks. Young black and whites sold to 256p or £1,643.52 from Hungersheath Farms Ltd, Ashley. The

Martin Family, Longford had their usual strong line up of cows to 238p to gross £1,970.64 for a black and white, PA.JE.J. Vaughan, Alvaston cow to 234p (£1,656.72), Mr James Oulton & Family, Audley cow to 233p (£1,579.74) and HR.SL.&OD. Bonell, Hankelow Norwegian Red to 233p (£1,850.02) to mention a few. The section average returned at 195p or £1,211.85.

18 Sucklers - Totally dominated with native breeds and those sold to 257p or £1,768.16 for a Saler from IWL. & PE. Evans, Llanwddyn who also saw 256p (£1,792.00) for their Angus. Sandwell Metro Borough Council, West Bromwich saw their Herefords to 245p (£1,489.60) and 226p (£1,243.00). In the lump Mr R.P. Thompson, Hinstock Angus grossed £2,086.24 to mention a few. The section average returned at 235p or £1,505.56.

Few less forward which is understandable in the current climate and a very varied show in the ranks from barren cows to 900p plus kilo bulls and everything in between hand-weight and good shaped cattle found a stronger trade and many more could have been sold to vendors advantage. Some heavier cattle and certain bulls still hard to place but a total clearance with most vendors realistic where the current finished cattle price is. Lets hope going forward as we move into September and the end of the holiday season and the drought easier in Europe and the UK a bit more demand moves through?!

Top calls reverberated around the ring to 438p for heifers or £2,540.40, 428p for steers or £2,902.44 and 382p or £3,405.48 for bulls. The overall market average returned at 335p or £1,975.26.

38 Bulls - Some bulls easy to place and others hard work but when you look at the bull trade nationally its not very exciting!! Sucklers peaked at 387p or £2,136.24 for a Limousin from Mr Richard Reynolds, Woodhouse Eaves and further bulls to 382p (£2,475.36), 370p (£2,160.80) etc, The Whitley Family, Spon Green saw their Limousins to 381p (£2,720.34) and 361p (£3,119.04). In the lump D.I. Roberts & Son, Brooks Limousin grossed £3,405.48. Natives saw Herefords to 341p (£1,882.32) from Mr David Benbow, Hilderstone.

Drayton specials saw black and whites to 314p or £1,758.40 from Mr David Lea & Family, Loggerheads. The section average returned at 330p or £2,040.84.

47 Steers - A better sample forward and finding a brisker trade especially for handy weight well fleshed types and these sold to 428p or £2,495.24 for a Blue Cross from distant supporters The Brown Family, Nuneaton and 410p (£2,513.30). Closer to home Mr Darren Young, Balterley sold Limousins to 382p (£2,505.92) and 361p to return £2,902.44. Mr Brian Owen, Market Drayton pair of corks to 380p (£2,492.80) and 378p (£2,457.00) for Limousins. Mr Graham Noden, Norton-In-Hales Simmental to 376p (£2,413.92) etc, Mr John Lea, Blore Blue Crosses to 375p (£2,497.50) and 361p (£2,483.68) etc and Mr Charles Forrester, Northwood Charolais to 374p (£2,236.52), 357p (£2,163.42) etc. Natives sold to 349p (£1,982.32) from AD.&J. Potts, Newbold. The section average returned at 344p or £2,204.24.

66 Heifers - Certainly more bite to the trade for the right animals and more suckler bred and well fed handy weight heifers required meet growing demand. Trade raced away to 438p or £2,540.40 for a Limousin from the Brown Family, Nuneaton and Blue to 402p (£2,465.40). Closer to home LG.Farms Ltd, Market Drayton run of Limousins sold to 412p twice £2,397.84 and £2,200.08 and 403p (£2,111.72). The Dutton Family, Styche Hall saw their Blonde to 392p (£2,030.56) and T.A. Warner & Son, Stoke Heath Limousin to 389p (£2,077.26) to mention a few. Natives saw Herefords to 347p (£1,811.34) from Mr J.C. Simpson, The Blythe. The section average returned at 338p or £1,884.92.

The August Show & Sale supported by the Western Holstein Club and sponsored by Olivia Starkey Planning & Development was judged by Dave Green.

The champion was the first prize pedigree heifer SANDLEY MAY 229 from George H Sanderson & Family, Preston which sold for £3,780.

The top price was £3,800 for the second calver BIDDLEA PRIDE PAPOOSE which was the second prize pedigree cow from Ray Brown & Partners, Holmes Chapel. They were also awarded first prize in the same class for another second calver and she sold for £3,550. Their three second calvers averaged £3,433.

Clayden Farm Partners, Crewe sold 3 cows to average £3,350 with second calvers to £3,400 and a fourth calver at £3,400.

Hilltop Farming Co, Northwich averaged £3,503 for their three heifers selling to £3,680 and £3,580.

R & J Madders, Adbaston were awarded first and second prizes in the commercial heifer class selling for £3,400 and £3,200 to average £3,233 for their three.

LF Horton & Sons, Northwich averaged £3,117 for three heifers to a top of £3,250.

An Ayrshire heifer from A Coutts & Sons, Knutsford made £2,900.

Less forward this week and trade not just as sharp. Still plenty of customers ringside and plenty of competition.

Cows and calves topped at £2,240 for a Charolais outfit from Mr R.H. Turner, Bradley who also sold in-calf Hereford heifers at £1,950 and £1,850. A very short entry of bulls made up of mainly Friesian types and over age sorts. Trade topped at £1,760 for a Blonde bull at 500kgs and section averaged £1,308 or 290p/kg.

Short of Friesians or dairy bred steers today with top end at £1,500 plus topping at £1,700 for Friesian steers from JH.&MR. Rushton & Sons, Kingstone and £1,695 for Swedish Red from Hollinshead Farms, Bentley. The farming types at £1,200 to £1,400 or averaging around 310p to 320p/kg.

Yarding cattle selling well in line with national trends with top end at £1,800 to £2,100 topping at £2,265 and £2,235 for Blues and Simmental from The Watson Family, Marton. Plenty of good runs of cattle at £1,700 to £1,800 to 340p/kg with better end at 360p to 380p/kg. Best of the native heifers at £1,700 to £1,800 and averaging around £1,575 or 330p/kg.

Trade for the 400kg to 440kgs cattle is around the £1,300 to £1,400 mark with some well bred steers achieving £1,500 plus.
