Few more forward and as usual thank you to our vendors and buyers for their continued support!! Great to see some more Arla producers selling through the live ring again and I would like to think some value added to their younger cattle going to further finishers. More buyer support ring side with both end users and further finishers which would have helped enhance prices especially for younger and plainer types for feeding also more trade for meated cows.

Hot take on the night, overage clean to 307p or £2,105.04, dairy to 287p or £2,178.80 and sucklers to 277p or £2,454.22. The overall market average returned at 200p or £1,241.72.

82 Dairies - An extremely mixed show and understandably a large contingent of very lean, light cows forward and these would be harder to place. But in contrast meated cows and younger grazing cows finding a stronger trade. Young lean black and whites topped at 287p or £1,716.26 from Mr Mark Lokier & Family, Newtown. Meated black and whites to 268p or £2,188.80 from Mr Richard Collins & Family, Hungersheath Farm Ltd, Ashley saw their cows to 234p (£1,591.20, 230p (£1,522.60) etc, a Brown Swiss to 228p (£1,796.64) from Ward Farms Ltd, Madeley, Norwegian Reds to 228p (£1,586.88) from Bloor Farmers, Pipe Gate and Ayrshire's to 227p (£1,602.62) from Mr Richard Vernon & Family, Hatherton. The section average returned at 180p or £1,075.23 but three quarters of the entry would be very lean cows.

22 Sucklers - More demand for good commercial cows with flesh and these peaked at 277p or £2,454.22 from Mr Ian Lewis & Family, Wolvey for Limousin and their Simmental to 241p (£2,087.06). Mr Emyr Roberts & Family, Llanfihangel saw 269p (£2,001.36) for their Limousin and 253p (£1,882.32) for their Blue Cross. The Warrington Family, Fole Simmental to 260p (£2,178.80) and natives sold to 249p (£1,558.74) for a Hereford from J. & B. Richards, Bangor-On-Dee. The section average returned at 240p or £1,622.67.

SFI26 WINDOW 2 UPDATE

Window 2 of the Sustainable Farming Incentive (SFI26) is expected to open on Tuesday 22 September 2026, following the closure of Window 1 on 28 August, which saw around 6,500 applications submitted.

KEY POINTS FOR WINDOW 2:

- Window 2 will be open to all eligible farmers and land managers.
- Applicants must be registered with the RPA and have a Single Business Identifier (SBI), with at least 3 hectares of eligible agricultural land linked to it.
- Farmers with existing SFI23, Countryside Stewardship Mid Tier, Higher Tier or HLS agreements expiring by December 2026 or existing SFI expiring the end of February 2027 can also apply.

Our team has been busy submitting Window 1 applications with agreement offers already coming through and are now preparing for Window 2.

Ensure the following requirements are met:

- All Cows are milked on the morning of travel
- Cow produces 20 litres of milk a day or less
- No wounds, scrapes or lesions
- No dropped udder
- Not lame (Score 0)
- Body condition of above Level 2
- Max 4 hour travel time to the Market



AUCTIONS RESPONSIBILITY

- Assess lameness (Must be Score 0)
- Assess body condition (Must be above 2)
- Provide water within 9 hours
- Provide feed within 12 hours



BUYERS RESPONSIBILITY

- Direct to Slaughter or AFU
- Slaughtered using pre-stunned methods
- Limited to 4 hours single travel journey
